## Guidelines for the selection of candidates through the open call:

Candidates for the residency program should

- be active visual art professionals in the early- to mid-stages of their career
- have a relevant tertiary qualification in a field related to their practice
- be at a stage in their career, or in a research-oriented project, at which a residency in Hordaland would be of benefit to their practice.
- of the residency format. intend to conduct research or further a project that is manageable within the constraints
- through sharing knowledge, being accessible to local art professionals, and/or having a be considered by the Jury to be able to contribute value to the Hordaland art scene, research interest that is particularly relevant to this context.
- The board approves the selection of open-call winners based on economic feasibility

# Guidelines for the selection of candidates through discretionary invitation:
