Dear Inge,

There is quite a bit going on in the salmon world of British Columbia right now, including meetings to address the siting of new salmon farms.

In response to this, and new evidence on diseases and parasites associated with salmon farming in BC, as well as the latest data for poor returns of Fraser River sockeye and other stocks and species, we are planning a special Speaking for the Salmon Scientists' Think Tank and policy makers information session for

January 25 and 26, 2017. The program - The Protection of Pacific Wild Salmon: Seeking Solutions and Controlling potential risk factors - will be a 1.5 day invitational Scientists Think Tank, including national and international scientists, followed by an invitational information session for policy makers including a number of members of parliament, First Nations representatives, senior bureaucrats and NGOs.

The think tank will be 'in camera' and focus on the state of British Columbia wild salmon. In addition, we will examine current and potential threats and address BC salmon aquaculture as a case study and example of one threat for which we have solutions. At the same time we will emphasize the Cohen Commission (2012) recommendations, and the Wild Salmon Policy. We are currently designing the program and will have a draft available very shortly.

We would be very interested in hearing about how the coastal management plan for Norway is progressing and an update on how Norway is balancing the benefits of salmon farming with the benefits of and risks to the wild salmon. Would you be available to join us for this meeting? If so we would be very pleased to cover all of your travel and lodging expenses.
