Its proximity to the sea and surrounding country-side provide opportunities for sport and relaxation activities.





David PHINNEMORE

Visiting professor, EU International Relations and Diplomacy Studies Department (Bruges campus)

David Phinnemore (UK) is Professor of European Politics, Jean Monnet Chair in European Political Science and Dean of Education in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences at Queen's University Belfast in Northern Ireland.

He holds a BA in European Studies (1990) and was awarded his PhD in European Studies by the University of Kent at Canterbury in 1998. His teaching interests are focused on the European Union – notably its institutions, decision-making procedures, external relations and enlargement. Inevitably much of his current work is focused on the process and potential implications of Brexit, the form that a new UK-EU relationship might take, and the consequences of Brexit for the EU and for Northern Ireland.

David Phinnemore research interests cover EU treaty reform, EU enlargement, EU external relations, particularly association, and Brexit'. These have resulted in a range of publications, notably: The European Union's 2007 Enlargement (Routledge, 2012, edited with C. Chiva); Reflections on European Integration: 50 Years of the Treaty of Rome (Palgrave, 2009, edited with A. Warleigh-Lack); Romania and the European Warlsproof (Routledge, 2008, with D. lagree

Trust, 2006); Understanding the European Constitution: An Introduction to the EU

Constitutional Treaty (Routledge, 2005, with C.H. Church); and The Penguin Guide to the European Treaties Penguin (Penguin, 2002, with C.H. Church). He has also contributed chapters to a range of edited volumes and published articles in the Journal of Southern Europe and the Balkans, Journal of Common Market Studies, Journal of European Integration, European Foreign Affairs Review, Revue d'Etudes Comparatives Est-Ouest, Southeast European and Black Sea Studies, and Perspectives on European Politics and Society. His most recent monograph, The Treaty of Lisbon: Origins and Negotiation, was published by Palgrave Macmillan in September 2013.

Professor Phedon Nicolaides holds the Jan Tinbergen Chair for European Economics. He is also Professor at Maastricht University. He was educated in the United States, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom. He obtained a PhD in economics and a PhD in law.

He previously held academic positions at the London Business School, the Royal Institute of International Affairs (London) and the European Institute of Public Administration (Maastricht).

Professor Nicolaides also gained experience in government as Minister Plenipotentiary in the Cyprus Ministry of Foreign Affairs and in the private sector as Secretary General of the Cyprus Shipping Council. During the negotiations of Cyprus for accession to the EU he was advisor to the Cyprus Chief Negotiator. He has acted as consultant to a number of public authorities in various EU Member States and to international institutions and organisations such as the European Commission, the European Investment Fund, the European Economic and Social Committee, the OECD and the UN.

His research interests are European integration, competition policy and state aid, and policy implementation. He published extensively on these subjects. Professor Nicolaides is also member of the editorial boards of several journals.

Özlem TERZI is Associate Professor at the Department of Political Science and International Relations, Istanbul University. She is, inter alia, the author of *The Influence of the European Union on Turkish Foreign Policy* (Ashgate, 2013). She obtained her PhD in International Relations from the Middle East Technical University (METU) in Ankara. She was a DAAD research scholar and junior fellow at the 'Zentrum für Europäische Integrationsforschung' (ZEI), University of Bonn. She studied as a Jean Monnet scholarship holder at the London School of Economics, where she received her MSc in European Studies.
